WHAT IS THE JOB? Auditor, 5101

WHAT IS THE STARTING SALARY? GRADE MA 11-12 (minimum – \$43,187- Atlanta, GA)

WHAT ARE THE MAJOR DUTIES? Audit production and financial records of milk processing, manufacturing plants, and cooperative associations to verify compliance with Federal milk order provisions. Duties also include preparing work papers and documentation which support findings and conclusions. Must represent the Market Administrator in contacts with dairy industry, colleagues and staff in a manner which consistently demonstrates respect, fairness, and cooperation in all official business.

- A bachelor's degree in any other field with at least 15 semester hours in accounting. Semester hours in investigative or research courses may be substituted for accounting.
- Applicants who do not have a degree must have appropriate semester or quarter hours described above, and experience that, when combined with the education, would equal a 4-year course of study. The experience should have equipped the applicant with the necessary skills and knowledge to perform at the grade level to which appointed.

A copy of your college transcript is required.
